Note from the Board Chair:



A year ago, we were in the throes of a worldwide deadly pandemic. Calls for social justice could be heard around the world. The economy was in tatters. We did not know what the future held. We did not know if Trees Matter would continue to exist.

Our first thought was, how can we help? And thus, the Resiliency Project was born. The 100 trees we are planting at Spaces of Opportunity, in collaboration with Tiger Mountain Foundation, will be a living memorial to Arizona residents affected by Covid-19. They will also provide much needed shade and fresh fruit for the Spaces Community. We are enormously proud of this project. You can read more about it in the paragraphs below.

We were determined to advance our mission despite the pandemic. Staff worked remotely and spent much of their time "Zooming" with each other and outside organizations. We re-engineered our SRP tree distribution events in order to safely protect folks arriving to pick up their free trees. Employees from SRP, many of them arborists, volunteered to help us plant trees for our Trees for Schools program, providing more tree shaded playgrounds to greet the kids when they returned to school after a year of remote learning. And most amazingly, donors gave generously from their hearts, allowing us to be more productive than ever before during a time when the community needed us the most.

I am grateful for our treemendous Board, staff, volunteers and donors who redoubled their efforts throughout this eventful year. We could not have accomplished what we did without every single one of you

FY2021 at a glance:



"2020-2021 was a year that really showed what we are capable of as a team. Going from a suddenly canceled spring workshop season, to a full webinar series in less than 4 months, pivoting our entire process remotely in the middle of an intense health crisis. Shade Tree Program

Working in conjunction with the Salt River Project (SRP) utilities company, we distribute thousands of free desert-adapted shade trees to SRP customers across the Valley. Participants can receive up to two free trees after attending a workshop where they learn how to plant and care for their new shade trees. In 2020 and 2021, Trees Matter adapted with COVID-19 by moving the workshop online, and doubled involvement. By the end of each year, we distribute approximately **5,000 trees** and educate over **4,000 Valley** residents, but far surpassed that amount (see figures on left).



Trees for Schools

Trees for Schools advocates to provide more tree infrastructure into schools while teaching staff and students on the importance of trees and tree care. It goes beyond simply planting the tree--the maintenance and care of the tree that follows is critical to the success of the tree. We are determined to educate schools on this by having the students, staff, and maintenance crews be an integral part of not only the planting itself, but also the knowledge on how to care for their new trees in the long term. We are happy to collaborate with school districts within the Valley to get more trees into schools!

Urban Food Forest

The Urban Food Forest program is to demonstrating devoted important function of community engagement that trees provide by showing how different trees can be harvested, processed, and prepared as a means of food. Events in the series are designed as a community building program with opportunities to attend potlucks, happy hours, workshops, go on harvesting events, and volunteer to help educate the public on the free food that trees provide. Events occur quarterly and at locations throughout the varying Valley.

This recipe book Highlights various trees that both grow and produce food in the Valley! The book is organized by harvest season and features over 20 trees.

Resiliency Project

For those who risked and lost their lives to COVID-19, Trees Matter is paying tribute to them by planting and dedicating 100 trees in their honor. The Resiliency Project was born to commemorate those affected most from COVID-19, while also acknowledging communities of color that have been affected at disproportionate rates and providing greenery to their communities. Additionally, Trees Matter partners with the Tiger Mountain Foundation, an organization which provides opportunities for formerly incarcerated people to learn practical life skills while improving their communities.





Note from Executive Director, Aimee Esposito:

"As Executive Director of a small nonprofit, a key tenet of my responsibility is to maintain and grow Trees Matter's financials so our organization can continue to create impact through our mission to inspire and promote increased tree canopy. This year we not only grew our budget and revenue but we continued to slowly diversify our revenue streams. Our donor and grant funding increased thanks to generous donations from our monthly members, donors, and grant makers who trusted Trees Matter to utilize their investment to increase our programming. We did increase our programming, which you can see in increased programming expense, about 1.5 % percentage and a little over \$60,000 more than last fiscal year. One revenue stream we did not have this year is special events, this is due the pandemic and our priority for safety during this time. As we move into the future we hope to continue to increase our programming expenses, fundraising efforts, and diversity revenue streams. Thanks to our individual donors, members, grant makers, and business partners we are more diverse than we ever have been!"

Many of you are interested in how you can advocate to protect, plan, and plant more trees.


